

The following ordinance was offered by Ed Watson  
and seconded by Joseph Merritt :

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING SECTION 15 OF THE CHARTER OF  
THE TOWN OF HOMER, LOUISIANA, TO PROVIDE FOR  
THE COMPENSATION TO BE PAID TO THE MARSHAL

SECTION I. BE IT ORDAINED by the Mayor and Board of Selectmen of the Town of Homer, Louisiana, in Regular Session convened on the 9th day of December, 2002, that the charter of the Town of Homer, Louisiana, be amended, pursuant to the provisions of Louisiana Revised Statutes 33:1181, as follows:

SECTION II. Section 15 of the municipal charter of the Town of Homer, Louisiana, is hereby amended and restated to read as follows:

"Section 15. Marshal to be elected; residence and term of office of marshal; compensation.

No. 1. There shall be one (1) marshal for the Town of Homer, who shall be chief of police. The marshal shall be elected by the qualified voters of said corporation to serve a term of office of four (4) years.

2nd. To be eligible for election to and to continue in the office of marshal, an individual must reside and be domiciled within the corporate limits of the Town of Homer.

3rd. The compensation of the marshal, commencing January 1, 2003, and thereafter, shall be Thirty-Two Thousand and No/100 Dollars (\$32,000.00) per year, payable monthly. The Board of Selectmen may increase the compensation of the marshal by majority vote, however any such increase in the compensation of the marshal shall not be effective during the current term of office of the marshal."
