- Whether elected or appointed is a world of difference
- Lawrason Act presumes elected, but appointed chiefs exist in munies where the yearsted as of August 1970, AND in towns where the people have voted to authority the mayor appoint the chief subject to board approval.

- Generally, both appointed and elected have responsibility for enforcement of law and ordinances within the municipality, which authority runs concurrent with the sheriffs it.
- For appointed chiefs, the Mayor is really the de facto chief of police for all administrations of matters; so it is a very delicate dance that the chief and mayor perform such a positive of friendly and on the same page.

§423.28. Town of Homer; authority over police personnel by chief of police

Notwithstanding the provisions of R.S. 33:423, in and for the town of Homer, the chief of police shall appoint, promote, discipline, and discharge police personnel subject to the budgetary limitations established by the mayor and board of alderman pertaining to the number of allotted positions for the police department.
